





Joshua and Caleb



- Two against ten
- Almost 39 years later, Joshua and Caleb were the only men of their generation to enter the promised land
- Joshua was chosen to lead the people in the conquest
- What happened with Caleb?

Caleb asked for a special inheritance

 He made his request at the age of 85

- He understood that he would have to drive out the inhabitants of the place he requested
- He requested Hebron, the mountainous region in the southern part of the territory



Facts about Hebron

- An old city (Numbers 13:22b)
- Abraham's residence for some time (Genesis 13:18)
- Where Abraham buried Sarah (Genesis 23:19)
- Later, Abraham, Isaac, Rebekah, Leah and Jacob were buried in the same place (Genesis 25:10; **49:29-32**; 50:12-13)
- This was the most frightening place to the spies that went up with Caleb and Joshua
 - They encountered the sons of Anak, descendants of giants (Numbers 13:22)
 - This family was the reason the 10 spies gave up (Numbers 13:28,32,33)



Biggest prize and biggest obstacle

- In the sense of national heritage, Hebron might have been considered the most valuable site in Canaan
- And that is exactly where they faced the biggest obstacle!



- Caleb saw the giants when he was 40 years old, and was willing to take them on then, because of his trust in God (Numbers 14:6-9)
- He never forgot those adversaries, and he never abandoned his faith in God
- 45 years later, Caleb asked Joshua for authorization to conquer the land of the giants
- As Caleb had always believed would happen, God gave the victory to him and the tribe of Judah against his adversaries, and they took possession of Hebron (Joshua 15:14-19; Judges 1:10)

Important lessons

- If an 85-year-old man defeated the giants, he certainly could have done it 45 years before
- The story of Caleb's courage and his victory over Hebron does not show the strength of the man; it shows the power and faithfulness of God
- Caleb understood the principle that David would state centuries later (1 Samuel 17:45-47)
