



Practical approaches to Bible study


- Objective: encourage study and application of the Scriptures
- Basic principles:
 - Though the last lines of the Bible were written over 1900 years ago, its message is still valid and relevant
 - Jesus said His word is eternal (Mark 13:31)
 - Peter said the gospel message is permanent (1 Peter 1:22-25)
 - We should pay attention to the messages God revealed to humans



Difficulties in comprehending the Scriptures


- Differences of time: the ancient world was different
- Cultural differences: the Bible was written in Asia and Europe by people from other cultures: Hebrew, Greek, Roman, etc.
- Language differences: written mostly in Hebrew and Greek
- Preconceived notions: caused by centuries of human digression
- Original difficulties: Peter admitted this when he commented about Paul's writings (2 Peter 3:16)

It would be wrong to give up: God revealed His word for our salvation




- Power to salvation (Romans 1:16-17)
- God desires that all be saved (1 Timothy 2:4)
- God is accessible (Acts 17:27)
- He wants us to seek Him (Hebrews 11:6)
- He sent His Son to communicate with us (Hebrews 1:1-2)

Your salvation depends on God, not men!



- Popes and priests did not bring the word from heaven
- Pastors did not reveal the truth to the world
- God has spoken to all of us!

God has spoken to all of us!



- God created us capable of understanding words and communicating verbally
- He revealed Himself through words
- To say that the Bible is incomprehensible is to deny God's power to communicate with the humans He created!



Knows How to Speak

We need interpretations

- Foreigners: other languages
- Professors: difficult vocabulary
- Children: difficulty in enunciating words

The understanding of the Scriptures

- Different interpretations lead to conflicts and divisions
- Many teach complicated systems of hermeneutics
- These approaches may clarify or confuse as they defend certain doctrinal tendencies

I do not deny the need for our effort to understand the Scriptures

But let's focus first on the divine side of the question

God is capable of communicating with the humans He created



Knows How to Speak

The capability to communicate verbally was given to humans by their Creator

- On the day that He created the first couple, He spoke to them
- God speaks in terms that we are capable of understanding
- Let's look at what God said to arrive at some important conclusions



What did God say?

- He used words to communicate responsibilities, permission, prohibition and consequences
- Later, He punished their disobedience (Genesis 2:17; 3:23)
- God, being just, demanded obedience and punished them, so it is evident that the couple understood!
- Eve erased all doubt (Genesis 3:2-3)
- Even when God communicated through messengers, He expected obedience and punished disobedience (Hebrews 2:2; 10:28)





God spoke to all of us

How did God speak in the beginning?

- The first words were spoken directly on the day He created Adam and Eve (Genesis 1:27-31; 2:15-17)
 - In the generations after Adam, God spoke directly to several others:
 - Noah (Genesis 6:13)
 - Abraham (Genesis 12:1; 17:3,9,15,19; 22:1-2)
 - Jacob (Genesis 28:13; 35:1)
 - And others

He also used messengers

2 Peter 1:16-21

2 Timothy 3:16-17

Angels (OT & NT)


- The word means Messenger
- It can be a human Messenger
- More commonly: messengers sent from heaven
- Angels are mentioned from Genesis to Revelation
- Prophets (OT)
 - Predicted the future? Yes
 - Primarily preached relevant messages
- Apostles and prophets (NT)
 - Predicted the future? Yes
 - Primarily announced the gospel message

God gave proofs to confirm these messages

- Fulfillment of prophecies (detailed and exact)
- Miraculous signs (Exodus 4:8; Hebrews 2:4; 2 Corinthians 12:12)
 - Moses in Egypt
 - Elijah in Israel and Phenicia
 - Paul in Asia and Europe
- The word always above the signs (Deuteronomy 13:1-5; Galatians 1:6-9)

Even when God used messengers, He expected the hearers to obey (Hebrews 2:2; 10:28)

- Today, we have the superior covenant of Christ (Hebrews 8:6)
- The Son's word is weightier (Hebrews 2:2-4)
- Jesus was clear (John 12:48)
- Paul reinforced this teaching (Acts 17:30-31)
- The New Testament message was not revealed only for Jews or only for Christians. It is for all nations!



God, through His Son, Jesus, revealed His word for all of us!
