WHAT IS FELLOWSHIP

- koinonia κοινωνία
 - Partnership, i.e. (literally) participation, or (social) intercourse (Strongs)
 - Close association involving mutual interests and sharing, association, communion, fellowship, close relationship (BDAG)

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2 CORINTHIANS 6:14-16

¹⁴ Do not be unequally yoked together with unbelievers. For what fellowship has righteousness with lawlessness? And what communion has light with darkness? 15 And what accord has Christ with Belial? Or what part has a believer with an unbeliever? 16 And what agreement has the temple of God with idols? For you are the temple of the living God. As God has said: "I will dwell in them and walk among them. I will be their God, and they shall be My people."

- Who determines the bounds of our fellowship?
 - God calls us into fellowship with Him and His Son (1Cor.1:9) (2Cor.5:18-20)
 - We desire to be reconciled to Him and enjoy the blessings of His fellowship (2Cor.5:17) (Eph.1:3-11)
 - •We have no standing to make demands or negotiate terms (2Cor.5:14)
 - The Lord sets all the terms for reconciliation (2Cor.5,6,7)

- •What are the bounds of our fellowship?
 - OGod is the basis of our fellowship
 - •We may be in fellowship with those who are in fellowship with God
- •The bounds of our fellowship are the bounds of God's fellowship

- God has no fellowship with sin
 - o (1 Jn.1:5-6) This is the message which we have heard from Him and declare to you, that God is light and in Him is no darkness at all. If we say that we have fellowship with Him, and walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth.



- God has no fellowship with sin
 - O (Matthew 7:23) "And then I will declare to them, "I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness!"

- God has no fellowship with sin
 - (2 John 1:9-11) ⁹ Whoever transgresses and does not abide in the doctrine of Christ does not have God. He who abides in the doctrine of Christ has both the Father and the Son.

- We cannot have fellowship with God and continue in fellowship with sin
 - o (2 John 1:10-11) ¹⁰ If anyone comes to you and does not bring this doctrine, do not receive him into your house nor greet him; ¹¹ for he who greets him shares in his evil deeds.




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 - (2 Timothy 3:5) having a form of godliness but denying its power. And from such people turn away!


- We cannot have fellowship with God and continue in fellowship with sin
 - (Eph.5:6, 7, 11) ⁶ Let no one deceive you with empty words, for because of these things the wrath of God comes upon the sons of disobedience. ⁷ Therefore do not be partakers with them.

- We cannot have fellowship with God and continue in fellowship with sin
 - (Eph.5:6, 7, 11) ¹¹ And have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather expose them.

- Fellowship with God and one-another
 - (1 John 1:3) that which we have seen and heard we declare to you, that you also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with the Father and with His Son Jesus Christ.



FELLOWSHIP COMPROMISES

- The Gospel / Doctrine Distinction
- The Imputation of Christ's Righteousness
- Re-interpreting 2 John 1:9-11

GOSPEL / DOCTRINE DISTINCTION

- •Claims that we must agree on "gospel" but can disagree on "doctrine"
- •Gospel and Doctrine used interchangeably in Scripture (Rom.1:15-16; 6:17-18; 10:16)
- A distinction without a difference

IMPUTATION OF CHRIST'S RIGHTEOUSNESS

- •Claims that the perfect obedience of Christ is transferred to the believer – Covers sin and "sinful nature" like an umbrella (Borrowed from Calvinism)
- •Romans 4 teaches that God imputes or accounts our faith as righteousness, but says nothing at all about imputing Christ's personal righteousness to us
- Necessarily leads to Once Saved Always Saved

REINTERPRETING 2 JOHN 1:9-11

- Limits "the doctrine of Christ" to the doctrine about Jesus as the Christ
- Applies limits of fellowship only to those who deny the humanity of Christ
- •Does the immediate context limit our application of a general truth? (Matt.15:3-9) (Gal.5:1-4) (Jas.2:1-5) (Ac.15:24)

REINTERPRETING 2 JOHN 1:9-11

- The "doctrine of" Christ...
 - O(Matt.16:6, 12) doctrine of the Pharisees
 - O(Ac.2:42) apostle's doctrine
 - o(Col.2:22) doctrines of men
 - o(1Tim.4:1) doctrines of demons
 - O(Rev.2:15) doctrine of the Nicolaitans
 - ODoctrine of Christ (Matt.7:28) (Lk.4:32) (Mk.11:18)

CONTINUOUS CLEANSING

- Claims that Christ's blood automatically cleanses a Christian of sin, before and without repentance
- 1 John 1:6 2:1 is used to defend this claim
 - Text plainly conditions forgiveness upon confessing one's sins which necessitates the recognition of what one is doing
 - O Clearly states that we cannot have on-going fellowship with God while continuing to practice sin (1 Jn. 1:6)

Unity in Doctrinal Diversity

- Claims that we cannot all understand the Bible alike
- Has no objective standard for determining which parts of the Bible will allow this diversity of faith
- This concept makes man a judge of the law (Jas.4:11)

Unity in Doctrinal Diversity

 Violates the Scriptures that forbid the extending of fellowship to those who are not teaching the truth

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o (Rom.16:17-18)
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- 0 (1Cor.15:33)
- o (1Tim.1:18-20)
- o (2Jn.1:9-11)
- (Titus 3:10)

MISAPPLICATION OF ROMANS 14

- Claims that Romans 14 applies to matters of "faith"- to matters of considerable moral and doctrinal import
- Immediate Context (Rom.13:11-14; 16:17-19)
- Remote Context
 - Moral sin condemned (Gal.5:19-21)
 - Doctrinal error condemned (1 Jn.1:9-11)
 - oFellowship with sin condemned (2Cor.6:14-17)
